Out of a Senior Class of approximately forty students, all four students who applied from Rambam Mesivta for the prestigious Yeshiva University Honors early admissions program were accepted. Rambam, since its inception over 25 years ago, has been consistently sending students to the YU Honors Program and now **Charlie Grill, Yoni Grossman, Samuel Sicklick**, and **Akiva Schuck** are part of this legacy.

Charles (Charlie) Grill of Long Beach, is currently an Honors Student at Rambam Mesivta. His favorite subjects include Calculus and Halacha. He is Head Coordinator of the Blood Drive and part of the Entrepreneur Academy. He has been part of many teams such as Flagfootball, Debate and Model UN. Charlie is currently the President of the Bach Synagogue in Long Beach, NY and has been a counselor at Camp Kaylie and interned at Cedarview Capital, a New York City hedge fund over the summer. Charlie plans on spending a year in Israel after he graduates.

Rosh Chodesh is never complete without the Kavana and inspiring voice of Yoni Grossman. Yoni is a Dean's List student and a stalwart member of Rambam's Masmidim After School Learning Program. He is part of the Double Beis Medrash program and, last year, he was part of a committee to visit the German Consulate to discuss the school's attempt to prevent the desecration of a Jewish gravesite.
